



## NEW SPEAKERS: CRITICAL SOCIOLINGUISTIC ANALYSES

1-Day training workshop on research methods and data analysis.

Stockholm, April 27 2016

This event is geared for PhD Students and other early career researchers interested in the practicalities of interpretive data analysis. It is intended to help students come to grips with this delicate phase of research particularly from the perspective of critical sociolinguistics, which generally designates research oriented to address social problems and inequalities associated with language. The event will combine a presentation on how work on new speakers can help engage with the discipline critically, a general reflection on issues of analysis plus a data session in which a subset of the participants will present preliminary data of their own.
